- •Worked and exhibited more in Europe than U.S. but was featured in Columbian Exposition in Chicago and one person show in Cincinnati in 1893.
- •Influenced by Frank Duveneck (Cincinnati artist trained in Munich)-strong painterly technique.



- •Known for treatment of women and children, often in informal genre settings but also did still life and portraits.
- •Bold, strong style with painterly quality, confident brushwork with strong color and light.
- •Traveled extensively in Europe, using the local people and culture as inspiration for her work.
