

Our community has weathered a challenging year, but it has provided us with a new understanding and appreciation of our obligations to each other as humans. In light of this,

the KIA's commitment to local artists is stronger than ever. We invite you to visit the WMAS in our galleries and online, to celebrate the artists in our region, and to connect to the depth of experiences that they share with us through their work.

Each year, the KIA selects a juror from outside of the immediate area to offer a fresh perspective on our thriving creative community. This year, the esteemed Larry Ossei-Mensah accepted the role. 
